Sample Incentive Itinerary - Kingdom of Fife

Day 1

Arrival at Edinburgh airport where a warm Scottish welcome awaits from [St Andrews Executive Travel](#) and guide who will be with the group throughout their stay. Transfer by luxury coach across the forth bridge and into the Kingdom of Fife and up to [Fairmont St. Andrews](#) for Breakfast canapés at the clubhouse overlooking St. Andrews bay and the stunning skyline. Breakfast at leisure, before transfer to the famous [Old Course Hotel, Golf Resort & Spa](#).

After check in and a chance to explore the hotel; lunch is served in the Road Hole Grill overlooking the world's most famous fairway. The afternoon can be spent relaxing in the roof top hot tub and spa, or for the golfing fan why not indulge in a golf lesson at the Dukes Course. Non golfers looking to brush up on their history can take a private tour of the historic town and take in the history of the home of golf, the Castle and Cathedral and Scotland's oldest University. And for the more adventurous try your hand at Land Yachting with [Blown Away](#) on the west sands famed for its appearance in the film 'Chariot's of Fire'.

This evening enjoy welcome drinks beside the crackling open-hearth in the Jigger Inn which dates back to the 1850's an historic building which is steeped in history, followed by dinner in the [Rocca Restaurant](#) located within the [Macdonald Rusacks Hotel](#) overlooking the famous 18th hole and Royal and Ancient Golf Club. Then why not take in some creative culture with a show or comedy at [The Byre Theatre of St Andrews](#).

Day 2

Following breakfast in the conservatory today takes you into the heart of Fife to enjoy some action packed activities at two of Fife's premier activity centres. The morning commences at [Cluny Clays](#) set in the rolling Fife countryside. With top of the range facilities for plenty of activities and sports, as well as purpose built meeting and conference facilities. Test your skill with clay pigeon, air rifle shooting or archery or challenge your team to one of many team building activities available from quad bike trekking, Honda pilot racing, mini highland games or falconry.

A delicious lunch is served at [Best Western Keavil House Hotel](#), set in 12 acres of landscaped gardens the hotel is located only 18 miles from Edinburgh city centre and Edinburgh International Airport.

After recharging your batteries the coach will transport you to Scotland's National Motorsport Centre [Knockhill Racing Circuit](#) for an adrenaline filled afternoon.

If you like life in the fast lane then why not try your hand at rallying or why not put your very own super car through its paces round the track! And for those of you who take things at a slower pace choose from either kart racing or 4x4 off-road driving. Enjoy the evening at your own leisure with a luxurious spa treatment or relax in the roof top hot tub. Enjoy a short evening stroll into St Andrews town centre and dine in one of many restaurants catering available in the historic town whether you wish to sample some traditional Scottish cuisine, traditional Thai, Indian, Seafood or Tapas, there is something to cater for all pallets.

Day 3

Following a full Scottish breakfast Golfers are transferred to [Kingsbarns Golf Links](#), one of the world's best with dramatic sea views from each hole and a traditional links heritage course, dating back to 1793. After play, enjoy refreshments in the Club House. Non-golfers can take a trip to [Griselda Hill Pottery](#) in Ceres where work on Wemyss Ware Pottery can be seen in progress. Wemyss Ware® has a long and distinguished history and has been collected by many famous people, including Gore Vidal and Elton John. Then onto the [Hill of Tarvit Mansion House](#) which was remodelled in 1906 by renowned Scottish architect Sir Robert Lorimer for a wealthy industrialist to house his superb collection of furniture, porcelain and paintings. Make yourself at home by making your own oatcakes in the kitchen with [Heritage Portfolio](#) or way not experience how and Edwardian family and their friends enjoyed their leisure time by playing the 9-hole hickory golf course.

Traditional afternoon tea is served at the [Rufflets Country House](#) hotel owned by the same family since 1952 which makes it a real home from home to spend a late afternoon relaxing. Enjoy a sumptuous tasting menu in your own private dining room at the Old Course Hotel followed by tales from Old Tom Morris, portrayed by local golf historian [David Joy](#), followed by a wee dram in the hotel's own Whisky Tasting Room before retreating to your luxurious room to get some much needed rest before saying farewell to the Home of Golf and Kingdom of Fife the following morning.
